She labored in the following missions: Greenville, Ohio; Elkhart, Indiana; South Bend, Indiana; Hope Mission, Cincinnati, Ohio; Bethel Mission, Springfield, Ohio; Hubert Avenue Church, Springfield; Pleasant Grove Church and Fairfield Mission, 1934-36, which was her last assignment.
