Organize New Church—A group of individuals from the Beulah Church in Elkhart, Indiana, plus several families from neighboring churches, have banded together to open a new church on Indiana Avenue, west of the city, in Baugo Township.

The new group has agreed to be a self-supporting church right from the start. A 4-acre plot has been secured on County Road 1 next to a new school just being completed. Pastor of the new congregation will be Rev. V. H. Yousey. A class was recently organized by Rev. R. P. Pannabecker, District Superintendent.

The first sod was turned in an impressive service on January 13. About 100 persons were present. The service was broadcast by remote control over WCMR, Elkhart.

Called Home — Miss Vianna Longenecker of New Carlisle, Ohio, a daughter of one of the pioneer pastors of the Ohio District, passed away on Friday, January 11. She was born June 8, 1875, and was 81 years of age.

Sister Longenecker entered the home missionary work of the Church in 1900. She labored in the following missions: Greenville, Ohio; Elkhart, Indiana; South Bend, Indiana; Hope Mission, Cincinnati, Ohio; Bethel Mission, Springfield, Ohio; Hubert Avenue Church, Springfield; Pleasant Grove Church and Fairfield Mission, 1934-36, which was her last assignment. She was class leader at New Carlisle for ten years.
